Winslow will be celebrating the 100th anniversary of the "PETTICOAT GOVERNMENT" with a parade, a reenactment swearing in the ladies, a presentation by the Daughters of the American of a plaque for the Helen Dunlap Mountain School for Girls, and to end with cake and ice cream until we run out. (With a big cake and over two hundred cupcakes there should be plenty.)

One hundred years ago, the men of Winslow were tired of the women complaining about the way they ran the city.

When election time rolled around and the women decided to run for office. the men all got together and withdrew their names from the ballot and chuckling said, "Let the women try to run the city for a year and just see how much they can mess up. They'll sit around, drink pink tea and gossip, or else they'll get into a hair pulling fight over some issue".

The women put together a slate of candidates consisting of Maud Duncan as Mayor, Audie Crider as Recorder and Clerk, Martha Winn as Treasurer, council women, Etta Black, Daisy Miller, Bee Cherveny, Florence Marley, Lida Cole, and Stella Winn. They won unanimously since no one ran against them.

There was no hair pulling, no pink tea nor gossip. The ladies got down to business and accomplished more in the first year than the men had in several years. The ladies ran again and won a second term.

When the men asked them to run a third time in 1928, they declined saying they were too busy with their other endeavors.

Come on out and join us for a bit of history, lots of fun, and good cakes. All women are invited to walk in the parade, ride a bike, a horse, a buggy, a scooter, or even a walker or wheel chair. The parade will be an abbreviated version just around Peek's Park and downtown. We'll even let the men have a place to gather and walk together to show support of the women.

City Council Corner

The Winslow City Council and Recorder/Treasurer Malkie began new terms in office in January. Along with several other initiatives, we will continue to focus on maintaining and improving the Winslow Water System this year.

In 2021, the Arkansas legislature passed Act 605 which, among other things, required retail water providers to commission a rate study, file it with the Arkansas Legislative Audit and the Arkansas Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Division, and implement the rates determined by that study. The studies of Fort Smith (where Winslow buys its water) said their rates needed to be increased in order for their system to be solvent. The Winslow City Council had to raise Winslow water rates to be able to continue to afford to purchase water from Fort Smith.

We recognize the challenge higher water rates impose on Winslow Water System users, especially those living on a fixed income. The Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) provided \$8,000 to help Winslow system users pay past-due water bills in 2023, though that funding is no longer available.

Simultaneously, our Mayor, Recorder/Treasurer, and Council have worked hard the last few years to secure grants and low-interest partially forgivable loans to fund our Water Improvement Plan (WIP).

With funds from the American Rescue Plan Act and Arkansas Natural Resources Commission, we replaced all of the outdated water meters with new remote-read meters, freeing up more time for our service technicians to find and fix system leaks.

We secured a low-interest, partially forgivable loan from the Arkansas Natural Resources Commission Clean Water Revolving Loan Fund to install a second tank by the one on Mt. Gayler. This tank will relieve pressure during power outages, provide additional water as needed, and allow uninterrupted service during cleaning and maintenance of the existing tank.

We received a \$500,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) from the Arkansas Community and Economic Development Program to add a large water tank next to our small, aging backflow tank, put up required fencing, and clean and paint the existing tanks.

We obtained leak detection equipment to help find damage to our miles of aging water pipes that cause wasteful system leakage.


