PRAIRIE GROVE, Ark. – Prairie Grove Battlefield State Park will host a free Tracing Your Ancestor Genealogy Workshop.

Discovering details about our ancestors can give us a glimpse into their lives and legacy. Make plans to join us on Saturday, January 25, from 6 p.m. - 8 p.m. as we share research methods to trace your ancestors during this workshop at the Latta Barn. 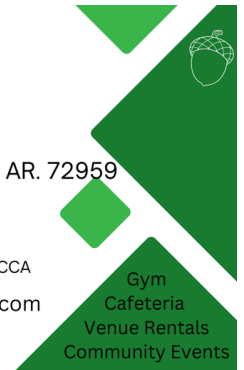

New LED lights have been installed in Station 1, 2, and 4, replacing the old 220volt lights. This should lower electric usage at each location.

Yearly service for all 34 SCBA units has been completed by an outside service.

A State Grant has been applied for in the amount of \$30,000, which was written to go toward upgrading to an automatic truck tanker.

The top responding firefighter for 2024 with the most runs made is **Shane Provence**. I appreciate all the volunteer personnel for the time they take away home and family to make the calls we have. I show the total runs for 2024 were over 450 between Washington and Crawford counties.

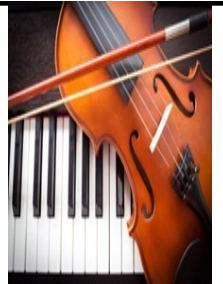
