Meters are water department (WD) property – customers should not turn the meters off or on without authorization from the WD or unless there is an immediate emergency.

If you must turn off your water, you will continue to be charged the minimum monthly water bill.

If the WD turns off your water (for vacation, shut-off, etc.); there is a \$20.00 turned off fee and a \$20.00 turn on fee; but you will be saving the monthly charges including taxes, usage fees, and potential late charges.

2023 Act 833 AR Grant fund reporting for Washington and Crawford county, totaling over \$20000, has been completed. These funds are used to purchase state approved items or services needed for the department. The Fayetteville Fire department has allowed the use of their portable hose testing unit. This unit will allow all our hoses to be pressure tested to meet yearly testing requirements. We have had several needed maintenance repairs done on fire apparatus at Station 3 and 4. Our yearly Engine pump testing was done on May 20th.

Philip Owen Kelley, 87, of Winslow, AR, went home to Jesus on May 8, 2024. Phillip was preceded in death by his wife, Loretta (nee McFerrin) Kelley; his parents, Lester and Lucy Kelley; and his brother, Louis Kelley. He was a member of the Fellowship Bible Church of Springdale, AR.

He is survived by his children, Mike (Cheryl) of St.

Louis, MO; Mark (Sandy) of Kalamazoo, MI; Margaret of Winslow, AR; his grandchildren, Emily (Nick) Wodicker, Ian (Analisa) Kelley, Alyssa Kelley, Jonathan Kelley, Kathryn Kelley; and his great-grandchild, Ronan Phillip Kelley.

Philip was born in Shaberg, AR. He graduated from Mountainburg Sr. High School in 1954 and Ozark Bible Institute in 1957 in pastoral studies. He married Loretta McFerrin on August 2, 1957. They moved to Olive Hill, KY, where Philip pastored Smokey Valley Bible Church. All 3 children were born in Kentucky. Philip moved his family to Hasty, AR, in 1964, where he became the director at Rock Haven Bible Camp. He served there as director until 1972 and continued to serve on the board of Rock Haven Ministries till 2015.

In 1972, he moved his family to Brentwood, AR, to pastor the Brentwood Community Church until 1992. Philip worked for B&B Resources from the 1970's until his retirement in 2002.

Philip was a man of many talents – he was a master craftsman in wood and built fine furniture, including office furniture, houses, storage buildings, and the Rock Haven Camp tabernacle which was relocated to Buffalo River National Park. Philip was a mechanical genius – there wasn't a motor that he couldn't repair or rebuild. Because of his long love of the Crosley automobile, he built a Crosley pick-up, using parts from two Crosley vehicles.

Philip loved people – he never met a stranger. He was always interested in their stories and was eager to share his own story with them! He loved his family deeply which was most often demonstrated in his willingness to help with any projects.

Most of all, Philip loved his Lord Jesus Christ. He lived the gospel in his preaching, teaching and acts of service. His greatest legacy is that all his children and grandchildren love and serve the Lord. Many others attribute their coming to salvation in Jesus Christ with Philip's testimony and teaching of the Word of God.

Services will be held at Moore's Chapel in Fayetteville, AR. Visitation is on Friday, May 24, from 6-8 PM. Funeral service is on May 25, 10 AM, at Moore's Chapel with graveside service to follow at Brentwood Cemetery in Brentwood, AR.

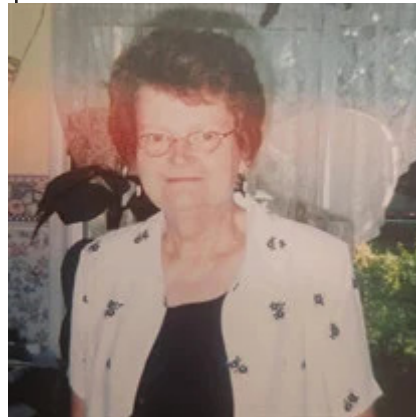

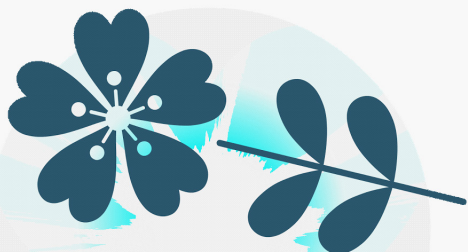

Mark Christison, Jr., age 52, of Fayetteville died June 5, 2024. He was born August 13, 1971, in Fayetteville.

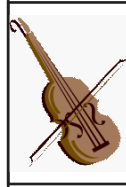

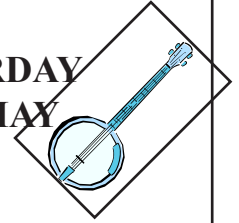

From The Voice Of One On The Top Of Brentwood Mountain!

Part VII Preparing for the Latter Rain

The sealing of God and the Marking of the beast are completed by the time probation closes at the end of the world. Just before God's people are sealed, the bible prophesies that the Holy Spirit will come in full force, a special event called the latter rain.

The prophet Joel wrote of the former and latter rain, known in agriculture as two periods of heavy rainfall crucial to crop growth and harvest (Joel 2:23). Joel paralleled these times to a special outpouring of the spirit (vv.28, 29) just before "the great and awesome day of the Lord" (v.31). The apostle Peter identified Pentecost as the former rain (Acts 2:14-21). The Later Rain is yet to come.

Joel's prophecy states that the Holy Spirit will be poured out "on all flesh" (Joel 2:28), to every person living on Earth. But look at what occurred during the former rain: There were those who were "confused" (Acts 2:6) and "Perplexed" (v.12) at, even "mocking" (v.13), the working of the Holy Spirit.

That is, they did not receive the former rain at its outpouring. Likewise, not everyone will receive the latter rain. Given what we've learned, we know that those who reject this second outpouring of the Holy Spirit will not receive the seal of God. If you are living at the end of time and do not receive the latter rain, neither will you be marked to enter the Kingdom of heaven.

Christian author A.W. Tozer said "If the Holy Spirit was withdrawn from the New Testament church today, 95% of what we do would go on and no one would know the difference." We could learn a few things from the early church. What did those disciples do to ensure they received the former rain?

Studied God's Word (Acts 10:44): one of the Holy Spirit's duties is to "guide you into all truth" (John 16:13), but how can He if you don't give Him the Opportunity to do so. (See also 6:63.)

Persisted in Prayer (Acts 1:14): Remember God will never force you to do anything against your will. If you want the Holy Spirit, Ask for Him! (Zachariah 10:1; Matthew 7:7).

They Were Willing to Obey (Acts 5: 32): you cannot obey God without the Holy Spirit, but you can be willing to surrender your will to His. (See also John 14:15-17.)

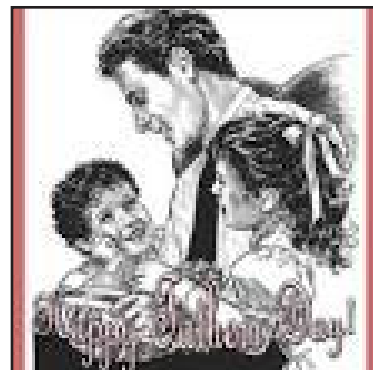
Gather to Worship (Acts 4:31): This doesn't mean that you must always physically be with other believers in order to receive the Holy Spirit. Rather, God's blessings fall upon us particularly when we honor Him together (See also Matthew 18:20; Hebrews 10:24, 25.)

Were united in Truth (Acts 2:1): Divisiveness which results from pride, envy, and resentment (Corinthians 3:3; James 3:16), turns away the Holy Spirit; a merciful, humble, and repentant attitude makes room for Him (Ephesians 4:30-32). The disciples allowed the Holy Spirit to prepare their hearts beforehand---and He made them ready to receive Him in full abundance!

The Time Is Now By no means are these truths less relevant now. Our choices today affect who we become. Though some reading this may go to the grave before Jesus returns, they also, in a sense, will be marked as either loyal to God or Satan. Everyone makes this decision, weather during there lifetime or at the end of time.

"Now is the day of salvation" (2 Corinthians 6:2 my emphasis); "choose for yourselves whom you will serve" (Joshua 24:15). Don't allow your decisions to cause you, like the foolish virgins, to miss out on eternal life, invite the Holy Spirit into your heart today and every day. Be prepared to receive the seal of God. See you there,
