# WINSLOW'S 2021 ARBOR DAY TREE SEEDLING GIVEAWAY MARCH 6TH

On Saturday, March 6, 2021, Winslow--recognized as a Tree City USA since 2016--will celebrate Arbor Day across from City Hall. Everyone in the area is invited.

Starting at about 9 am, after the mayor reads the Annual Arbor Day Proclamation, free tree seedlings (native to this area of the Ozarks), will be given away, first come, first served, and ending when we run out of trees.

Covid-19 masks and social distancing will be required.

After the mayor's reading, anyone wanting tree seedlings will form a line with people maintaining 6 -10 feet in separation. The seedlings will be clearly marked, with information pages available on

the height, spread, soil conditions, etc. for each tree. People are

asked to bring plastic bags in which to carry their bare root seedlings. A tree expert is expected to be there to answer questions and to address the importance (to wildlife and the environment) of planting native trees and getting rid of invasive species.

The species available include the following: PawPaw, Shumard Oak, Washington Hawthorn, Chinkapin Oak, Bur Oak, Gray Dogwood, and Buttonbush. The following may be available, but are not certain at this time:

Flowering Dogwood, Witchhazel, and Blackhaw. Quantities are limited, so we will try to distribute them as fairly as possible.

Winslow Museum and City Hall is gettin' purdied up! The renovations are nearly complete. The new ceramic tile museum floor is finished. Flood damage is repaired, and many of the walls have fresh paint.

With folks getting covid-19 vaccinated, masks and six foot of social distancing, we hope to open our Winslow museum and City Hall again by spring. The Winslow Water Department will likely continue to work from it's current remote location, to facilitate a safer and more productive work environment for it's employees. Demands on the Water Department have increased, and they need more physical space and time to keep the the water running for our citizens.

In the meantime, Winslow City Hall/Museum could be used more as the central hub for our city counsel members, and Museum volunteers. Museum volunteers would be a friendly face to visitors who are seeking information about Winslow, or just out sight seeing. Be creative! Play music, rotate museum displays, purdy up City Hall and make it a fun place to be in Winslow. Wi-fi is available at City Hall and the City Hall/Museum phone number is (479) 634-3902.

If you love visiting with people, Winslow history and wanna get out of the house a day or two each week, please give us a call at 479 634-3901. We will need a few volunteers, before we can determine which days the museum will be open. We would like it to at least be open Thursday, Friday & Saturday.

# Hello from the Winslow Water Department!

Our goal is to get past due accounts caught up in early 2021, and so far, our customers have really been a great help with this goal! Thank you, thank you, thank you!

A friendly reminder, water bills will no longer be put into the renter's name. The homeowner will be responsible for paying the water bill on houses they own. If you no longer wish to rent your home to your current renter because of non-payment, you will need to inform your renter of this decision. We cannot be in the middle of conflict between renters and the homeowner. Thank you for your help with this.

Regarding Shut-offs: Accounts with a past due balance of \$100 or more will be on the shut off list, along with any renter who skips a payment. If you have a past due balance of over \$100, because of a leak, and are paying regularly on your water bill, you will not be in the shut off list, unless your balance is greater than \$500. We can no longer carry a balance of greater than \$500. Written shut off notices will continue to be sent, however, we will no longer be making courtesy phone calls to people who are repeatedly on the shut off list.

We are documenting locations of meters so our meter readers can more easily find the water meters. Many are really difficult to find! It would really help our meter readers if you could ensure your address is somewhere on your property. A 911 address sign can be obtained from the Fire Station, and would also help EMS find your home in the event of an emergency.

A reminder: brand new water meters are no longer available for installation OUTSIDE the Winslow City limits. Options outside the Winslow City Limits include water catchment system, drill a well, or contact Washington Water Authority for a new meter if your land is near their water system. New meters INSIDE the city limits are limited to single family housing for people who wish to make Winslow their home. Anything else will require approval from the City Council. Our City Council is exploring options for obtaining funding to upgrade our water system, which us currently at capacity.

Winslow Recycling will be Saturday, February 6<sup>th</sup> at the usual site across the tracks from City Hall on the edge of Peek's Park. Volunteers will not be present.

This list may help folks prepare for recycling. If it can't wait, recycling can be taken to 1420 S. Happy Hollow Rd. in south Fayetteville, N. on 71 and E. at the old IGA onto MLK (15th St.), 2-3 mi. behind Quality Collision Repair.

They are open 7 days/week, 24 hrs/day.

#### 4. LIST of accepted and clean recyclables:

## IN THE BINS OF THE TRAILER:

- --#1 See-through Plastic Bottles—must have a neck that is smaller than the bottom. (ex: soda and water bottles, peanut butter jars, etc.)
  --#2 Non see-through Plastic Bottles—must have a neck that is smaller than the bottom (ex: milk and water jugs, etc.)
- --#2 Colored and opaque—must have neck smaller than the bottom (ex: liquid detergent, shampoo, etc.)
- --NO margarine, yogurt, or other plastic tubs!
- --Mixed paper and magazines (must be DRY)—printer paper, junk-mail, slick-coated paper, envelopes, etc.
- --NO paper plates or cups, milk or juice cartons, frozen, food containers, egg cartons, etc.
- --Newspaper (incl. regular phone books)
- --Steel cans

#### IN THE BARRELS:

- --all colors of glass
- --old fabric, belts, shoes, small toys

#### IN THE TRUCK:

--cardboard and brown grocery bags

# PLASTIC BAGS ON GROUND TO LEFT OF THE TRAILER: separate into two groups:

- --aluminum soda and beer cans (to take for cash to Winslow Community Meals)
- --clean aluminum pie plates, foil, cat food cans, etc. (for Winslow Community Meals)

By now the old house had been torn down or burned, I can't remember which, and the yard was overgrown with weeds and light brush,
