

On Saturday morning, July 24, Covid-19 shots were given to people who made appointments, as well as to walk-ins at the newlyrenovated Winslow City Hall.

The plan was to make Covid-19 shots available right here in town, perhaps making the choice to have the shot a little easier, particularly in light of the false information campaign circulating about the vaccine.

Administering the shots was longtime Winslow resident and nurse Michelle Jarnagan (RN), as well as nurse Lori Mahler (RN), both of whom donated their time to this event. Michelle worked with Lori at Washington Regional for 15 years, and they have been good friends for 25 years.

Michelle worked as a nurse for 34 years, including at the Neonatal ICU for 30 years, and now works at Circle of Life Hospice. Lori has been a nurse for 40 years, also having worked at Neonatal ICU for 30 years, and is currently at the VA Hospital. We were truly fortunate to have two registered nurses of such experience and dedication.

To make an appointment, folks called Pastor Marsha Cooley of Blackburn Community Church, by the Wednesday before.

Working on the planning of this was Mayor Randy Jarnagan (who also helped at the event in City Hall), Marsha Cooley, Ken Stout, Michelle Jarnagan, and Lori Mahler.



- 4 I leave my waitress a big tip. The extra money might bring a smile to her face. She is toiling much harder for a living than I am.
- 5 I stopped telling the elderly that they've already told that story many times. The story makes them walk down memory lane & relive their past.
- 6 I have learned not to correct people even when I know they are wrong. The onus of making everyone perfect is not on me. Peace is more precious than perfection.
- 7 I give compliments freely & generously. Compliments are a mood enhancer not only for the recipient, but also for me. And a small tip for the recipient of a compliment, never, NEVER turn it

down, just say "Thank You.'

- 8 I have learned not to bother about a crease or a spot on my shirt. Personality speaks louder than appearances.
- 9 I walk away from people who don't value me. They might not know my worth, but I do.
- 10 I remain cool when someone plays dirty to outrun me in the rat race. I am not a rat & neither am I in any race.
- 11 I am learning not to be embarrassed by my emotions. It's my emotions that make me human.
- 12 I have learned that it's better to drop the ego than to break a relationship. My ego will keep me aloof, whereas with relationships, I will never be alone.
- 13 I have learned to live each day as if it's the last. After all, it might be the last.
- 14 I am doing what makes me happy. I am responsible for my happiness, and I owe it to myself. Happiness is a choice. You can be happy at any time, just choose to be!

I decided to share this for all my friends. Why do we have to wait to be 60 or 70 or 80, why can't we practice this at any stage and age?
