July was an eventful month for the City of Winslow.

- Meter Readings: You may have noticed that City had extra help reading the meters lately. This process will probably for the next couple of months. Please contact City Hall (634-3901) if you identify problems or concerns.
- Grants: The City applied for a Rural Community Grants and with matching funds from Winslow Community Meals. The goal is to obtain a portable back-up generator for Meals for the frequent electrical outages. If received, in case of emergencies, citizens using portable life-enabling devices will be able to plug in at Meals.
- Town Hall Meeting for the Fun Grant. While the meeting attendance was low, the topic was interesting. The City is applying for a \$50k Grant to continue repairs and hopefully purchase new playground equipment for the ball park. The majority of the funding, if awarded, will provide better access and parking for our citizens with disabilities. The remaining funds will go for playground equipment. Competition is heavy for this grant. Keep your fingers crossed.

The Arkansas Real ID/DL – Effective October 1, 2020

If you want to fly commercially after October 1, 2020, you have to change your current Arkansas ID or Arkansas Driver's Licence into a "Real ID". Sounds easy – right. Wrong!

First, you have to go to one of the select DMV office's (Fayette-ville's is now on MLK Road, just past Walmart, behind the Big O Tires on the North side of the road). There are ten stations, but usually three dedicated public servants working. Fortunately, all have been nice and patient.

When you go in to get a number – check the alpha on the number and then look below on the table to see if there are lower numbers of kind people that could not wait around and put their number back. Grab quick.

But, before you go and are disappointed as I was on my first visit

you must have the following documents (a couple of examples from each requirement):

- Proof of Legal Presence
- U.S. PASSPORT (Current Only) or
- o U.S. BIRTH CERTIFICATE no birth cards or hospital birth certificates

Important for females or males who have changed their names: If your name is different on any of the documents you are providing (i.e. you have been married and/or divorced and your birth certificate does not match your social security card or other identity you are providing – expect to have to return for another visit).

- Proof of Identity:
- o Current Driver's License or Identification Card
- Concealed Handgun License
- o Vehicle Registration/Title
- o Official work/school ID with photo
- One Proof of Social Security Number:
- o Social Security Card (Name must appear on Social Security card the same as on DL/ID)
- o W-2, or Form 1099, or recent Pay Stub with the applicant's name and FULL Social Security number.
- Two Proofs of Residency (following are examples and not full list):
- o Gas, water, electric, telephone (cell or landline) or cable/internet bill (must be issued within the last six months and show your name and the physical address that matches the information listed under "Proof of Identity" above.
- o Valid, current: AR hunting/fishing license, or Concealed Handgun Carry License, or State or Federal Tax Return.

 Now, after carefully reviewing all of the documents you provide;

the State employee will either bless or reject. If the documents are acceptable (trust me, every document will be reviewed closely), then you pay your \$10.00, get a new picture, and HOORAY FOR YOU! You are the proud owner of a new DL/ID. Good luck.





TOO LATE TO STOP THE TRAIN

A public service TV ad urges caution approaching railroad crossings because a train travelling 30 mph takes half a mile to come to a full stop. Many tragic accidents result from careless drivers approaching the track when it is already too late for an oncoming train to stop.

The Old Testament story of King Josiah provides a striking parallel. Josiah was a reformer, a great and good man, dedicated to purging his land of false religion. He began repairs to the temple which was in a ruinous state. During this work, the Book of God's Law was found in the ruins. When the King heard it read in his presence, he realized his people had been guilty of appalling violations of God's law because they had lost sight of His Word! God's spokesman declared that Jerusalem would be overthrown because of its sinful neglect of His word. Destruction was coming and nothing could stop it. Josiah's reforms came too late! God had already set in motion the events by which Jerusalem would be overthrown! Clearly, there is a point of no return in God's dealings with man.

1) This Is True of Nations. Man in the 21st Century has tried to remove God from history. We talk glibly about the "separation of church and state" as though such a thing were ever possible! God cannot be separated from the State because governments rise and fall at His will. (Acts 17.26.) History is nothing but the record of God at work among nations! God has repeatedly overthrown nations when their cup of iniquity became full. (cf. Romans 1.8) What of America??? Is it too late to stop the train?

2) This Is True of Families. Many families are neglecting the spiritual dimension of life. They make no attempt to attend church or study the Bible regularly. Perhaps they promise themselves: "Someday..." But Solomon warned that we can wait too long! "Remember also your Creator in the days of your youth, before the evil days come and the years draw near when you shall say. Thave no delight in them.'" (Ecclesiastes. 12.1) We can wait until it is too late to provide spiritual guidance for our families!

3) This Is True of Individuals. We can wait until it is too late to escape the consequences of sin in our own lives. It is possible to remain so long apart from Christ that no place is found for repentance. (cf. Hebrews 12.17) Hearts can harden in neglect; We can become so entangled in sin that we find it impossible to leave! There is a point of no return for the soul!

Though most people try not to think about it there is a coming day of reckoning with God. The time to prepare for that coming day of Judgment is now; Then it will be too late!
