

The Fish and Chicken Dinner and Auction was a great success. I appreciate all the help that went into making this event go so smoothly and fun. The total funds raised totaled over \$5400 dollars. The funds will be used for purchasing Zoll AED defibrillators to put in our responding apparatuses.

I am also excited to announce that our department has been awarded the Arkansas Forestry Wildland Grant that I had applied for. The kits will be available in March or April of 2025. Kits will include up to ten (10) sets of fire-resistance coveralls, ten (10) wildland firefighting gloves, two (2) back-pack pumps, two (2) back-pack leaf blowers, four (4) leaf rakes, and two (2) McLeod rakes.

City Ord. No 2020-010

Dogs Running-at-Large Prohibited

It is unlawful for the owner or person having custody of any dog to permit or allow the running-atlarge of such dog within the corporate limits of Winslow at any time.

For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "running-at-large" shall mean: not under the control of the owner, authorized representative of the owner, or a person having custody either by leash, cord, chain, fence, or other physical control; provided that a dog shall not be considered to be "running-at-large" when on the premises of the owner, the owner's authorized representative, or a custodian thereof and accompanied by the responsible party.

This Ordinance is enforceable, and copies of the Ordinance are available upon request at Winslow City Hall during normal business hours.
