## Water Department – Automatic Withdrawals from your accounts (ACH)

The Winslow Water Department is considering putting into place a process that would allow automatic withdrawals of your water bills from YOUR CHECKING or SAVINGS accounts each month. Many of you may already use this process with your electric bills, television cable bills, or other bills that you pay monthly.

- There would be no charge to you as long as you have money in the account to cover the water bill.
- You would still receive your monthly statement.
- If you currently pay by phone or credit card, you will avoid those fees.
- There will be a cap so if there is a leak or un-expected high bill; the charge will not take place and the Water Department will receive an alert.

ACTION NEEDED: In order to decide IF THE CITY WILL implement this program, the City is requesting your feedback to find out if enough people are interested in this program to implement it. #### Come Join Us

Extension Homemakers Club will get back to its regular meetings on May 4th after a year long hiatus because of the pandemic. This meeting is to elect officers for the next two years and set an agenda for the rest of this year.

Extension Homemakers is open to everyone, men and women of all ages. The club has expanded its horizons to include all phases of life. Not only homemaking but health, emergency preparedness, personal finance, person and family well-being, aging and many other aspects of living.

The Winslow Extension is committed to making teaching dolls, pillows and pillow cases, and blankets for the Arkansas Children's Hospital, ditty bags, pillow cases, lap robes, and tray favors for the local VA Hospital, making masks for several organizations and nursing homes, hospitals, businesses, schools, police departments, and many other places.

The Winslow Extension Homemakers Club have volunteered locally for projects such as preparing and serving food and working when the WCCA was renovating the old school buildings, making a quilt for a veteran at the Veteran's Day celebration, volunteering at Community Meals, serving on the boards of several of the local organizations and many other local projects.

During the Washington County Fair the members of the clubs volunteer to work in the Country Store in the Exhibit Hall. The proceeds from the Country Store funds scholarships for students in Washington County. In 2019 and 2020 two recipients each year were from Winslow.

The educational booths set up at the fair each year are constructed by EH Clubs. The last three years before the pandemic closed the fair in 2020, Winslow received two 1st place

Blue Ribbons and one Grand Champion Ribbon for the educational booths constructed by the club.

Winslow EHC usually meets on the 3rd Tuesday of each month for a luncheon meeting but we realize many people who work are interested in belonging to EHC.

We are interested in organizing an evening Extension Home-makers Club. This would be a separate club and would have its own officers and projects. #### WINSLOW'S ARBOR DAY **A SUCCESS**

On the morning of March 6, over 40 people--the biggest crowd in its five years--participated in the 2021 Winslow Arbor Day and Native Tree Giveaway, organized by the Winslow Tree Board and staged outside the Train Pavilion downtown. Everyone wore masks and observed the six-foot social distance markers set up to observe Covid 19 precautions.

Winslow's observation of Arbor Day started with Mayor Randy Jarnagan's

reading of the national Arbor Day Proclamation, after which people lined up to pick up over 200 free native tree seedlings that the City had purchased from the Missouri Department of Conservation. Special guests from Beaver Watershed Alliance--Nate Weston, Geospatial Biologist, and Kayla Sayre, Watershed Specialist--were there to help people find the "right" trees to plant for their area.

All the tree seedlings were of trees native to this specific area of the Ozarks, meaning that they are the trees most suited to our ecosystem, providing more food and habitat for insects, birds, and animals than non-native and invasive plants do.

The seedlings handed out were: Bur Oak, Gray Dogwood, Flowering Dogwood, Black Haw, Buttonbush, Shumard Oak, Paw Paw. Washington Hawthorn, Chinkapin Oak, and Witch Hazel.

In 2016, Winslow was awarded recognition as a Tree City USA. Among the requirements were to set up a Tree Board to organize an Arbor Day observation and community tree care projects such as planting trees at the Winslow ball park, Peek's Park (down-

town), and Tunnel Park, as well as the ongoing eradication of kudzu on the hill above Tunnel Park.


